

New stars joined the Walk of Fame in Tatralandia

DEMÄNOVSKÁ DOLINA (June 20, 2011) – One of the largest tourist attractions in Slovakia attracts more foreign celebrities. One week after the opening of the Walk of Fame in the largest year-round aquapark in central Europe already 12 shining stars of the showbusiness are glowing there. Among the new ones are Mahulena Bočanová, Leona Macháľková, Vendula Auš Svobodová and Gábina Partyšová.

Except for famous personalities from Poland and Slovakia another four stars are glowing on the Walk of Fame in Tatralandia. Celebrities from Czech Republic attracted hundreds of visitors to the favorite aquapark, as well as, the attention of important media. At least one famous name from abroad should be on the Walk of Fame this summer.

On Friday Czech stars flew to the Tatras via a newly opened regular connection Prague – Poprad. While sightseeing in Liptov they made a trip by cableway to Chopok and in the hotel Tri Studničky tasted the art of Chef of the year 2010, Roman Kováč. The main point of their stay was to relax with children in Tatralandia. They realized that this unique park is not only about swimming pools and toboggans, but also about many of entertaining attractions for the whole family in the beautiful scenery of the mountains.



The foursome of Czech celebrities definitely enjoyed the stay. Famous Czech actress Mahulena Bočanová, singer Leona Macháľková, TV host Gábina Partyšová and Vendula Auš Svobodová who gets involved in the project Kvapka nádeje (Drop of Hope), enjoyed comfortable accommodation in bungalows Holiday Village, swimming pools with thermal water and tens of slides and toboggans (including the novelty – toboggan Trio).

Famous guests also visited the Western City, where they absorbed the atmosphere of Wild West. The news is that this summer holiday the entry into Western City is for free. The celebrities, as well as, the children were impressed by the show in the Wild West style with many actors and stunt performances.

The atmosphere of Wild West is completed by stylish restaurants, bars, and typical Western stores. The visitors can also enjoy attractions, such as archery, tomahawk throwing, gold washing, horse riding or an electric bull riding. The main attraction is a natural open air theatre for 3000 visitors where there are many different performances during the day.

Tatry mountain resorts, a.s. is the largest subject in tourism segment in the Slovak Republic. It owns and operates attractive ski resorts and hotels in the Low and in the High Tatras.
