

Statistics of the skied days in the Tatras not only for competitive ones.

DEMANOVSKA DOLINA (16th March 2011) – Innovative company Tatry mountain resorts, a.s. introduced attractive service into operation – statistics of skied days.

In the resorts operated by TMR Company **visitors are supported to compete. Thanks to the most modern technology** of tourniquet system SKIDATA 370 and **joint connection of systems in the Tatras' resorts it is possible to observe the motion and use of ski passes at all transportation vehicles.** Since January the new service is available online at www.skiline.cc with the access via resorts web pages.

The skier needs to register at www.skiline.cc and type the number of his ski pass. Brief chart of altitude enables to display travelled altitude, number of used cableways, chairlifts and **skied kilometres.** It is also possible to share and compare the results with friends at Skiline and to figure out whether the skier is among TOP 100 considering number of skied kilometres.

“The service is used by youth mainly, who spend on the Tatras' ski slopes a lot of leisure time”, said Bohuš Hlavatý, chairman of the TMR Board.

The application available for the statistics in the resorts - JASNÁ Nízke Tatry – Chopok Sever, Chopok Juh, VYSOKÉ TATRY – Tatranská Lomnica, Starý Smokovec as well as for other partnership resorts PARK SNOW Donovaly, Štrbské Pleso, Veľká Rača.
