

Petra Kvitová on the Walk of Fame in Tatralandia

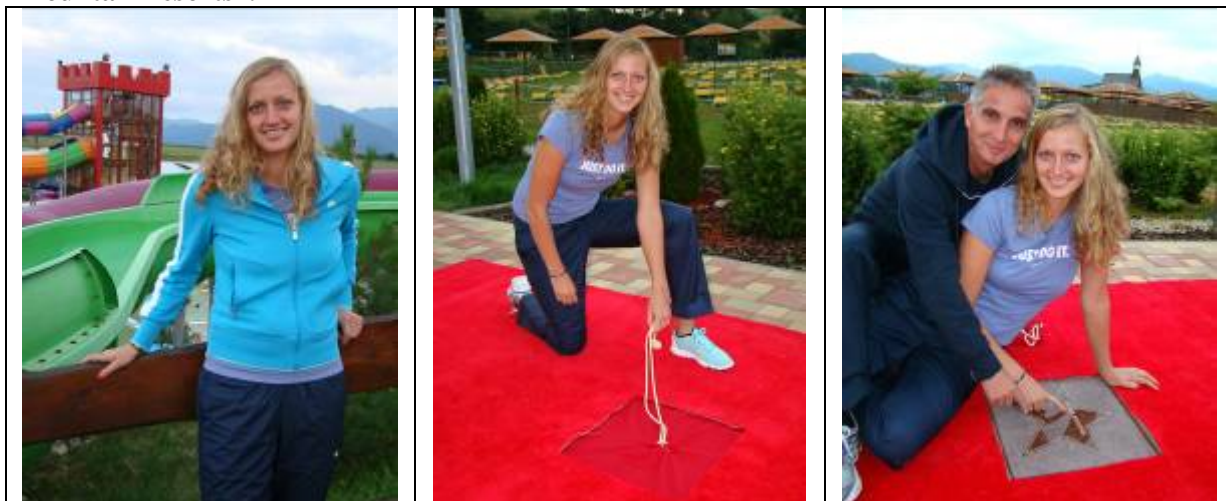
DEMÄNOVSKÁ DOLINA (July 25, 2011) – the Wimbledon winner, Petra Kvitová, uncovered her star on the Walk of Fame in Tatralandia, the largest entertaining water park with a year-round operation in Slovakia. Although Kvitová already has the star, she denies any special requests.

The Wimbledon champion **Petra Kvitova** attended a **training programme in Hotel FIS in the High Tatras**, where she prepared herself for next tournaments. With her conditioning coach, Jozef Ivanko she did not spend hours in the gym only, but they also did hiking and made trips in the Slovak mountains. **She finished the stay with a visit to Tatralandia.** The largest entertaining water park in Slovakia with beautiful views of the Low and Western Tatras is about a half an hour ride from Štrbské Pleso, where Petra trained.

It was not the first visit in Tatralandia for Kvitová. In the past, before the Wimbledon trophy, she visited Tatralandia with her conditioning coach and tried a unique U-shaped raft. A funnel toboggan called Tornado, the only one of its kind in the Eastern Europe, also attracted them. It was a great adrenaline experience for Kvitová and that's why she was looking forward to visiting Tatralandia.

Yesterday's visit in Tatralandia was more ceremonial. Petra Kvitová is one of few Czech celebrities, **who have a star on the unique Walk of Fame** along different famous names, although the Walk of Fame in Tatralandia exists only since June 2011. It is the 13th star in order, and Petra hopes that the number 13 will be a lucky one.

Petra uncovered and kissed the star with a great support and applause of visitors. During the ceremony of uncovering the star, Petra received an ambiguous question- whether she lets anybody to take advantage of her. She answered that she does not see herself as naive and will not allow something like that. The next question if she feels like a star Petra answered: **“I am a totally normal girl with no special requests, but I appreciate my first star very much and (this) invitation from Tatry mountain resorts”.**



The fact that Petra liked the water park confirmed the statement, that she plans a visit to Tatralandia soon, because yet she has not tried the new family raft toboggan Trio, which offers a triple ride experience. She did not disclose whether she is going to try it with her conditioning and tennis coach or her family.

Tatralandia is the largest water park in Slovakia and one of the largest ones in Central Europe. Tatralandia is not only about swimming pools and toboggans, but also about many entertaining attractions for the whole family. Visitors can enjoy entertainment and accommodation in beautiful mountain scenery.

Tatry mountain resorts, a.s. is the largest subject in the tourism industry in the Slovak Republic. It owns and operates attractive ski resorts and hotels in the Low and in the High Tatras. TMR's portfolio includes the resort Jasná Nízke Tatry and the hotel Grand Jasná, Tri studničky and Ski Záhradky hotels in the Low Tatras. In the High Tatras TMR owns and operates the resorts Tatranská Lomnica, Grandhotel Starý Smokovec and Liptovská Teplička, as well as hotels Grandhotel Praha Tatranská Lomnica and Grandhotel Starý Smokovec, and Hotel FIS Štrbské pleso. TMR has already invested over EUR 70 million of capital expenditures into these resorts and plans to spend additional EUR 65 million on projects, which will be focused on increasing the standard and visit rate of our mountains in the following years. The last TMR's acquisition is the aquapark Tatralandia, the biggest Slovak thermal aquapark, which, besides water entertainment, also offers an entertainment in the Wild West style in the Western City, as well as accommodation in bungalows and apartments of Holiday Village Tatralandia.
